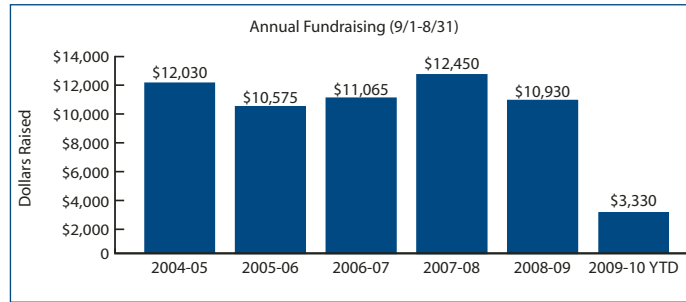

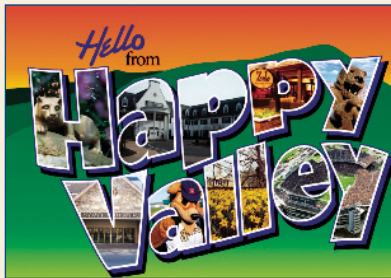
What Tops Your List of Things to Do in Happy Valley?

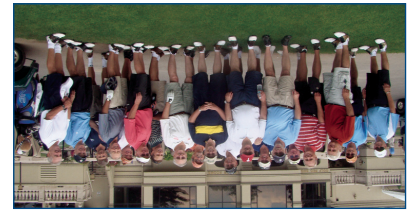
