

"You can't make this stuff up."

Monthly zoom calls filled with Pi Kap stories, jokes, and reunion plans

For the last nine months, Pi Kapps from the late '60s to mid-80s have a standing date on the first Thursday of the month. At 7:00 p.m., a Zoom meeting starts, and one by one, brothers' faces fill the screen. Some are driving home, or finishing dinner, or sitting on their porch. John Kieser '70 joins, then Harry Barfoot '77, Jack Hickey '74, and Gary Bello '69. They collectively wonder about John Talone '74, who just got back from a brothers' getaway in Ocean City, MD, and is late to join the meeting. "Is he hung over?" they ask facetiously. "Did anyone get arrested?" Another one sees Rick Say '72 and gasps. "Are you drinking coffee?? You'll be up all night!"

It's been 50 +/- years since they've been at Pi Kappa Phi at Penn State and for these brothers—that means four to five decades filled with brotherhood, good times, and memorable stories.

When their annual golf outing was cancelled last fall due to COVID, **John Kieser '70** decided to schedule a Zoom call. It was such a success that the virtual meetups quickly became a monthly feature. "The participants are all brothers from about 1966 to 1980," John says. "And typically we have about 20 brothers. I try to have a speaker who talks about a given subject and then we just talk about the good times in our lives and Alpha Mu and future get-togethers."

He says that it's been a great opportunity to renew old friendships with the brothers who went to Penn State with them, and a great way to continue their collective adventures together.

When I talked to John, it was two days before their June Zoom, and he invited me to join. I signed on to the call five minutes early, but a handful of brothers were already there, knee deep in a story that involved a trip to Ocean City over Memorial Day weekend. John Talone '74, Harry Barfoot '77, Rick Say '72 (Snake) and Skip Parks '80 were in a bar, and Skip was wearing a white Penn State shirt. A group of young women came into the bar, saw Skip's shirt and called out, "WE ARE." Harry Barfoot '77 says that the women introduced themselves, saying that



they were new grads, on a trip to celebrate their graduation. "Penn State transcends all generations," he says.

When John introduced me and explained that I was writing a story for Alpha Musings, I asked the brothers what I was dying to know. In a world filled with division, loneliness and disconnection, how have they kept such close, great friendships? How did Pi Kapp play a role in this connection where everyone has a nickname, and knows each other's favorite brand of beer, and remembers their hijinx from junior year? What's the secret sauce?

"Kegs and kegs and kegs," was the first offthe-cuff reply before **Gary Bello '69** replied. "You have to put our lives in perspective with what the world was like 55 years ago," he said. "Most of us came from lower middle class families. Most were the first in our families to go to college. Penn State was opening up a whole new world for us. We were very close."

John Kieser '70 added, "For me, it was the friendships. Some of the best friendships of my life were generated in the house. There's nothing more special than a good friend who can relate to me about how life has been. That's a real benefit for me."

Bill Sirocky '70 said that having all the brothers living in the house created a lifelong bond. "We did everything together." Don Holman '69 added that their connection as pledges taught them respect for authority and an incredible camaraderie within the pledge class. "Yeah, it was like boot camp," added Steve Yingling '69. "We were melded for a common cause."

That common cause that bonded them

years ago is still going strong. They were happy to plan the 2021 golf trip to Toftrees on August 6. "I know restrictions are lifting," **Harry Barfoot** '77 joked, "But if I'm in a foursome with **Jack Hickey** '74, I'm wearing a mask." "I sure hope that happens," Jack deadpanned back.

After talking more about their upcoming trip, **Gary Bello '69** talked to the group about his role as the chair of the development committee for the College of Engineering, and how Penn State alumni — the largest group of active alumni in the world — can help to preserve Penn State's ideals.

The call wrapped up, but not before a brief debate over the veracity of a claim that brothers with high GPAs used to get a celebratory steak dinner. **John Turcheck** '69 (Turk) chimed in, saying that he was in charge of buying food, and it really happened. Everyone with a GPA under 3.0 had to eat liver and onions that day.

On the first Thursday of July it will all start again — the outlandish stories, jokes, and dogs barking in the background. For these Pi Kapp brothers, it's a great way to keep up with what John calls "these very old and very special friendships." Want to join?
